We're likely to get less and less snow in the coming years, and getting some years with very little snow is a real possibility.
- include skate skis in the rentals. Have a discount for adults who don't want to purchase skis/poles and boots/ equipment but would rent on a regular basis. Monthly ski rental price and allow them to keep the equipment for that period allowing them to ski at times convenient to them. I know of several families from Kitimat who would be interested to do that, they would then purchase a membership.
- The stadium area doesn't drain well when we get mid season melts. Any way to enhance draining would likely help snow quality in stadium.
- Providing lights on the dog trail would be great! Especially living up here where it gets dark so quickly.
- Chose infrastructure. Lodge is less important but was bundled with rental shed
- I think at this point trails are all in great shape and so is the lodge. Of course future plans for lodge maintenance and upgrading could be included in the long-term objectives.

--More skier reported conditions on the website? Maybe a gear swap?

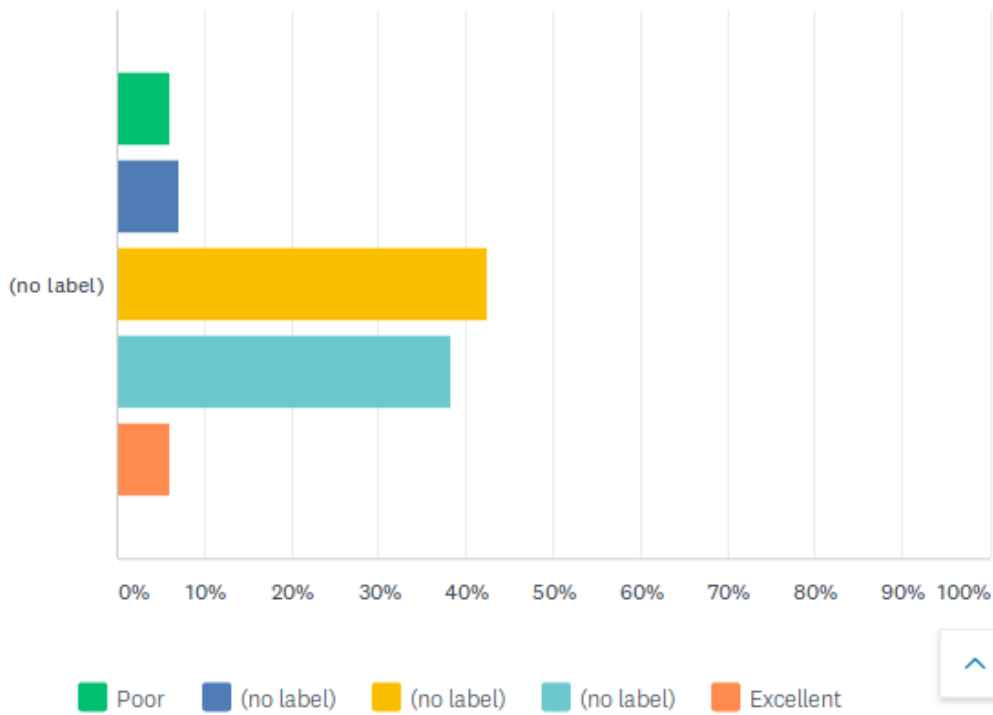

- Often no paper maps available in the lodge. Signs on the trails are deteriorating.

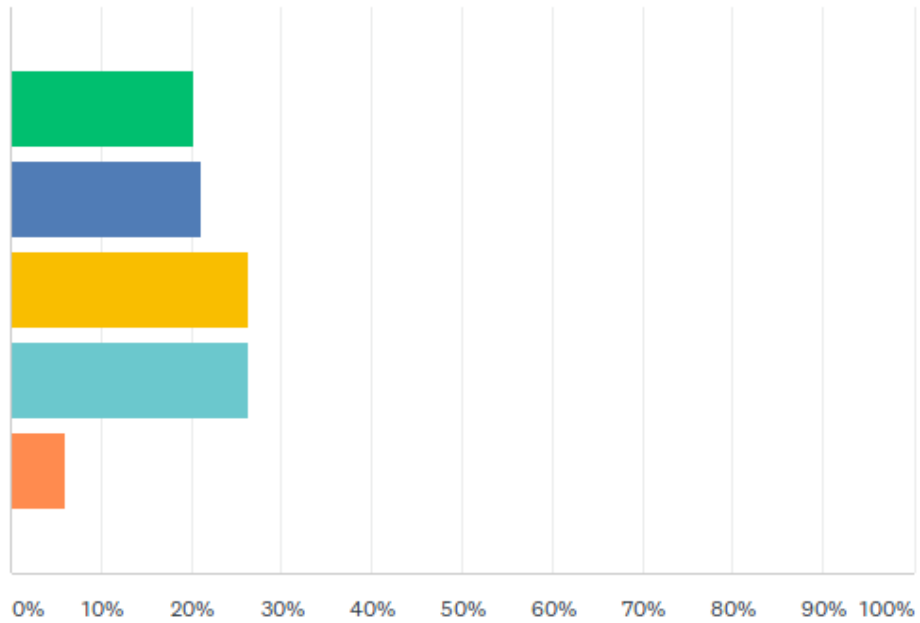

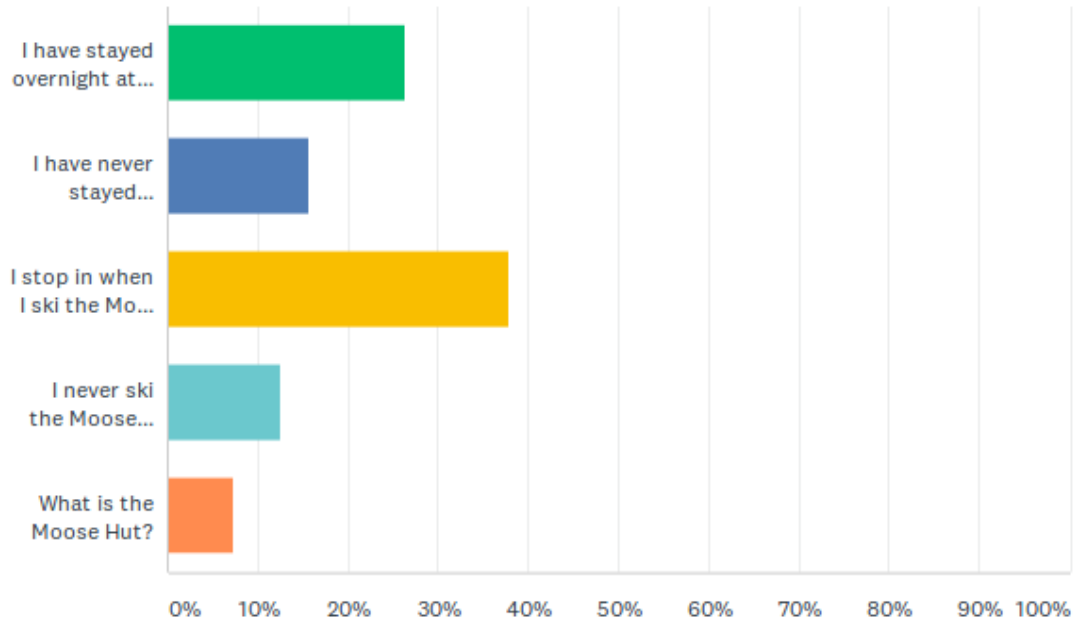

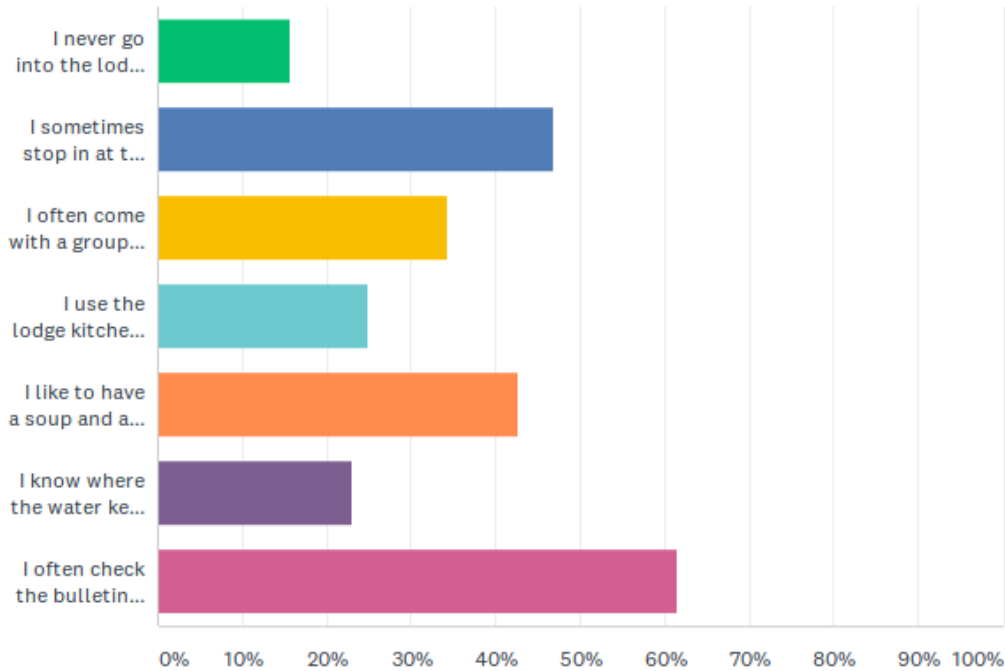
- On the past I have had many enjoyable cups of tea during day skis. I think it needs to be promoted as long as club has resources for safety and upkeep

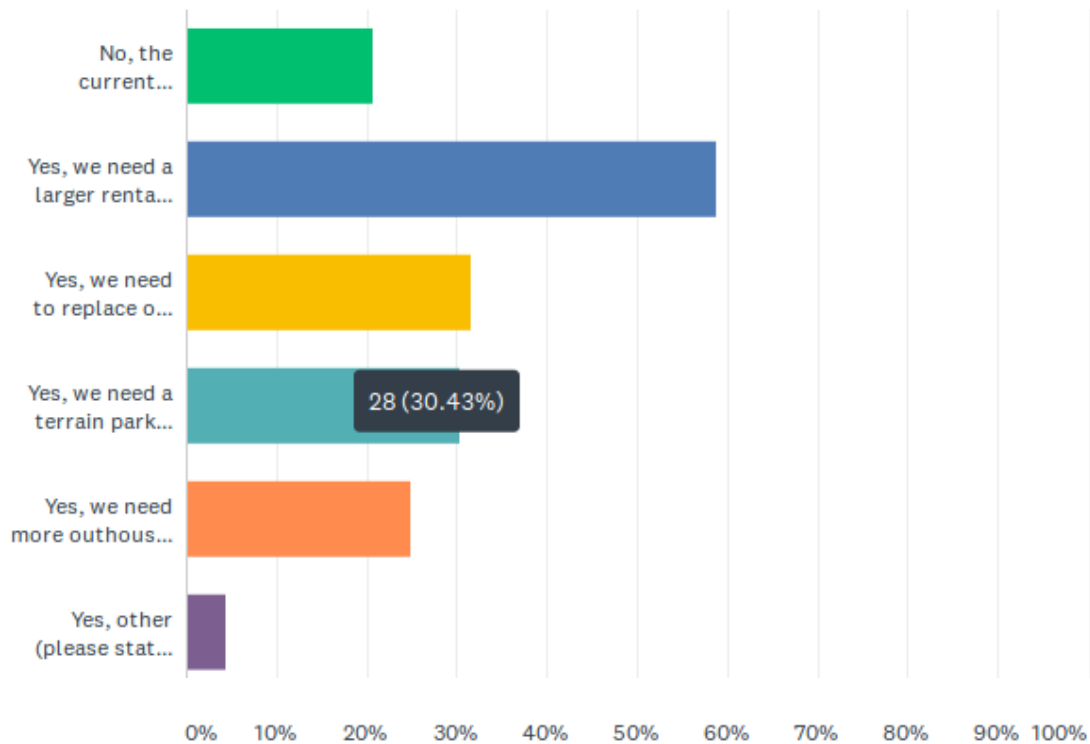

- A new lodge would be amazing, if we could have a dream facility it would include composting/ flushing toilets. But of course then someone would be cleaning etc (hehe). I don't ever go into the club house and think "this sucks". I always feel like it is a cozy place to be. I would vote for a new lodge as I feel like the roof line and snow fall is a hazard, that the area inside is a poor layout for group gatherings and that in such a lovely setting big windows would add aesthetic beauty. I am grateful for what we have there, but these are my dream wishes.
- Outhouse on Doggy
- Most other clubs have larger lodges. Ours is often crowded.
- no idea, seems that club already know what to do
- More rentals would be good. I would like to try skating but not able to get equipment
- The lodge is pretty full during weekends. It is sometimes hard to find a place to sit. And eventually a larger kitchen for the snowflake cafe and social events would be nice.
- Improvements with trail grooming
- More consistent grooming. I would pay more for a hired groomer rather than volunteer if it meant more regular and timely grooming. Grooming on a weekend afternoon seems like a waste of fuel and volunteer time, trails need to be ready for the AM.
- With climate change making weather unpredictable, I think it would be folly to worry about replacing the lodge. The close quarters on a busy day are part of what makes it feel like community. upgrade the rental shade and keep the skiers coming while we see what happens with the snow. Seize the moment!
- Terrain park, to me, does not require built "infrastructure", but rather a designated spot where the groomers can pile snow.
- we need more" Geography "in the stadium area (perhaps around the perimeter, not in the middle)
- I tend to ski at "off" times so can't comment knowledgeably.
- I like the current facilities but if you're seeing growth, perhaps I am wrong. I'm not a fan of infinite growth. As a member, I'm content.
- seems there are many outbuildings that are perhaps underused. so is there a need for more?
- Snowshoe trail added
- I don't feel qualified to answer this question as I rarely use any facilities other than the trails, The few times I have skied at other facilities ie Fernie, Calgary Olympic Park and Kananaskis, I felt our trails were superior.

- Many people without dogs use trail because it is so easy and flat. I think if it is truly a doggy trail then dog owners need to figure this out. I don't have dogs but if I see poop now I will better understand and hope I don't fall in it:-)
- Hidden cameras and public shaming? Provide compostable poo bags?
- No good ideas, sorry!
- More dog waste bins at frequent intervals.
- Perhaps a pee pole at various locations
- A couple of poo bag stations and garbage cans
- Free Baggie and disposal centers every km, so it isn't ever far to go to carry and dispose poop.
- Poop bag stations along the trail
- This is a toughie. Simply people should clean up after their pets. But clearly that isn't happening. As a pet owner and user of doggie trail I must admit it can be more than disgusting as the season wears on- as you all know. This is our suggestion: if you use the dog trail you pay an extra fee- because people can't keep track of their dogs. This fee covers the cost of someone having to clean up the trail. Only pet owners who use the trail pay a dog fee.
- ?
- Doggie bag dispensers. Fines for soiling.
- I don't see how we could improve that area. If a user is responsible themselves, we would not have a problem to begin with. Ferry island for example?
- Educating dog owners and keep encouraging them. You have to change the pattern that was set
- doggie bags along the trail garbage bins long the trail, patrolling the trail.
- Be nasty if required. More garbage cans.
- This is not a solution for unsoiling but how about an alternative? Create a non-doggy trail similar in character and length and offer a choice?
- bigger issue, need for enforcement people who actually can be respected when dealing with those who do not respect the other users
- Doggie diapers are probably not an option are they.
- No dogs
- Encourage pick up - now this means kicking it into the bush. If you don't want that then lots of receptacles are needed, you can't expect people is to ski any distance with a bag of dog poo.
- I am a dog owner and not as bothered about some messes on the dog trail. It has morphed into a popular beginners trail but started as a dog trail so non dog owners need to accept some mess is part of the community. Doggie bags and bins are welcome and I do clean up after my pooch ??
- Someone was telling me about a trail system that placed large scoops in intervals along the trail (think a large, wide wooden spoon about 2 feet long). These were used to fling the dog feces into the woods. Not sure if it would work here or not.
- Cameras to be able to look back and see the culprits or a sign that says video surveillance - please scoop your poop. Fines for not abiding. Maybe small cameras on high pooping spots? The honor system seems to be having trouble.
- Maybe provide poop and scoop bags? Maybe bigger bolder signage regarding clean up?

- People that bring dog's on the trail should volunteer twice a winter to go on a poop scoop run, they put their name on the list and their dog get's a free pass to use the trail. otherwise people with dogs who don't volunteer should pay a dog user fee. Of course reminders to pick up after your dog and drop containers on the trail should be the number one way to prevent a crappy ski.
- Encourage pick up of dog feces by providing biodegradable bags at beginning of trail and perhaps a garbage can
- Have dog owners either pay a membership fee for their dogs, or else take a shift scooping poop. Or pay someone to do it?
- Possibly include a question on the registration form for the season pass, which asks if you plan to ski with a dog and what the rules are if you do. Bringing awareness to all members that way.
- the bags and garbage at the start of the trail is a good start
- the Doggy bags and garbage bins are a great addition. Maybe another midway? But some people will never change.
- What about some form of tiny shovel borrowing system where you can take a tiny shovel at the start of the trail, it loops around your boot, so you don't get shit on your nice boot, and people scoop the poop along the trail?
- Humorous signage, dog memberships so there's a chance to talk with owners about their responsibility. Ask members with dogs-that could have been a question on this survey. do you ski with a dog? How do you think we can....
- Placing garbage cans and bags at the entrance of the trail was a great help. Perhaps placing a few more garbage cans down the trail would be useful.
- Signage, education, an area where the dogs can run (and poop) before heading out to the trail (might work for some dogs...I know mine goes in the first 5 minutes)
- Ugh! So frustrating. Wildlife cameras on the worst stretches? Two-tiered pay system: 1. I promise to pick up after my dog every time 2. I can't be bothered but will pay a higher pass rate knowing that someone else will do this disgusting job.
- Why don't you have two trails. One for dogs and one without. Whitehorse has that. There are two parallel trails that lead from the chalet to all the trails.
- A bin or two along the way. Baggies. Dog owners in charge of bins and baggies
- See above. The problem is mostly at the start. Dog owners need to walk the dogs somewhere else before using the trail. Doggie bags are a must on the trail. Two stations with bags (on both sides of the trail) should be clearly marked, with a reminder of proper etiquette A reminder (of responsibilities) should go out with one of the letters from the President.. Does anyone know whats being done by other clubs? Smithers?
- More signage
- eliminate the dogs!
- Public shaming.
- don't have any suggestions
- Oh wow. Comes down to owners. Often dogs are so far ahead or behind their humans there is no way they are being monitored.
- We are all volunteers. Just encourage people to carry small folding shovels, and pick up any soil soil snow that you see and throw it into the bush. Most of us do try to pick up after the dogs, but sometimes it is difficult to do fully.
- Sporadic garbage cans? The annoying part for me is packing my doggie's bagged poop.
- I don't know the answer to that question.
- Have users that come with dogs sign a Community Standards Document that states the clean up rules. Have doggie bags available wherever there are signs.
- Provide doggy do bags at the parking lot and at the beginning of the doggy trail.....and garbage cans to deposit said bags.....or everyone bring their own little poop shovels and toss the unsightly item into the woods.....
- It may be a fact of life that we have to deal with, if we continue to keep it open to Dog users, which is the point. Not sure the percentage of membership that use the trail as their primary trail.

--wish I had ideas as the few irresponsible dog owners make it uncomfortable for the rest of us. Maybe put more large signs up saying please pick up after your dog, If it doesn't improve maybe closing the trail for a trial run. Maybe stressing on our website that dog owners must pick up after their dog if they want the trail to be open to dogs.

--Make dog owners more responsible for their pet's behaviour while using the 'Doggie Trail'.

--Doggie bags and receptacles Revelstoke has numerous 'poop shovels' hanging along the trail

--Have dogs require a paid pass as well and have dog owners volunteer to clean up after the other dog owners that are not doing it. Maybe it would encourage them to pick up after their own dogs. Also another BIG thing for me with the dog trail is keeping the dogs off of it until it sets up like other trails systems do. How many times have I gone for a ski after fresh grooming and dogs have destroyed the tracks!!!! GRRRR

--I think the Doggy trail is a big attraction for people who would otherwise not come to Onion Lake. In the winter there are limited groomed outdoor trails in our area where a dog owner can exercise their dog. In my opinion, the Doggy trail is a good strategy to enhance membership. We need more trash cans along the Doggy trail for people to drop the dogs excrements and more Doggy bags available. Signage about Doggy trail etiquette. The trash pick up can be a volunteer task. I do not agree with charging an extra fee to dog owners for bringing their dog (s) to the trail.

--It's up to the member to have integrity

--Hold owners accountable. They should scoop and bag their dog's poop. Parking lot and Trail signage, website and Facebook notices should be posted.

--when dogs are off leash people do not seem to care about keeping track of their dog and what they are doing.

--Better signage and placement of disposal bin. Maybe a discussion that the trail will be closed to dogs if the rules aren't followed, or a moratorium. Suggest members may volunteer for trail clean-up.

--Oh boy.... the owner should be responsible. Maybe being subject to a fine? I have no idea how that would work though. (Sorry not very helpful!)

--Dogs on leash, well stocked poop bags at entrance and large signs through out the trail reminding people to pick up their shit.

--Have 2-3 garbage cans along the trail so waste can be deposited (it is difficult to ski with a bag in hand for a very long time!)

--There is no way to police this trail. You would think the users would take care of it. We just have to keep reminding people with emails and signage.

--No idea. Little shovels placed along the trail do you can flip it into the woods maybe

--Dogs and owners could have their own access (the new one); other people could use the Troll access to avoid the poop highway?
